

Advent is a Time to Prepare Our Hearts to Celebrate Christmas: During this Holy Season of Advent, I encourage you to find those ways you can prepare for the coming of the Lord. This holy season of preparation is a call to be those servants who are found ready for the Lord's coming. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas. Confession is an important part of preparing room for the coming of Christ into our hearts, that is, allowing Him to draw us into deeper conversion. Our **Advent Penance Services** will begin with Adoration at 7:00 PM on **Wednesday, December 14** and **Wednesday, December 21**. Confessions are also heard on Thursdays (9:15 – 10:30 AM) and Saturdays at 2:30 PM.

Receiving the Eucharist: Last weekend I spoke at all Masses about the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist and emphasized that it is the greatest treasure we have as Catholic Christians and comes with a tremendous responsibility. One way we express the proper care and custody of the Eucharist is ensuring that all those who receive Holy Communion actually consume the host. This is the only way to prevent desecration of the Holy Eucharist. Unfortunately, and extremely troubling, we have periodically found hosts in the Church and last weekend we found one in the parking lot. **As a result, I am asking that everyone who receives Holy Communion actually place the host in their mouth prior to moving their feet.** Again, if you receive in the hand, please place the host in your mouth before moving your feet. Obviously, this is not a problem for those who receive on the tongue. (Receiving on the tongue remains the preferred option of the Church.) Please see the fuller explanation of this request in the bulletin this weekend.



Reception of Holy Communion

During the past couple of months, we have unfortunately been finding Hosts throughout the Church following Masses. Recently, after the 10:00 AM Mass, a Host was found in the parking lot. Last weekend, Father Wilson made a special announcement prior to Mass regarding the reception and safeguarding of the Holy Eucharist. As the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian life, I would like to review its importance.

At the Last Supper, on the night he was betrayed, our Savior, Jesus Christ, instituted the Eucharistic sacrifice of his Body and Blood. This he did to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until he should come again, and so to entrust to his beloved Spouse, the Church, a memorial of his death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity. Thus, the Mass is the meeting ground between Heaven and Earth, between time and eternity. We, now on earth, experience a glimpse of Heaven when we come forward to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. He bends down to meet us and take us up into himself where he is seated at the right hand of the Father. Therefore, it befits us then to take pause and to contemplate, even just briefly, this meeting.

In 2006, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) issued a document entitled, *Happy are Those Who are Called to His Supper—On Preparing to Receive Christ Worthily in the Eucharist*. This document consists of a series of questions and answers concerning who and ways to receive the Blessed Sacrament.

Only those who have been baptized and are members of the visible Church may be admitted to Holy Communion. Being baptized and sharing in the Church's faith are the conditions for reception of Holy Communion. In order to receive Holy Communion, we need to be free to do so. This freedom not only means that we are baptized Catholics, but it also means that we are free from the attachment of sin and irregularities in marriage.

In everyday life, it is easy to get into a habit of going through the motions without pausing to think about what we are doing. The general practice in our parish has been for the faithful to form processional lines and for everyone to come forward one by one to receive Communion. It is also the practice of the Church that we are required to keep the Eucharistic fast, that is, refraining from food and drink (except for water and medicines) for at least one hour prior to receiving Holy Communion (including chewing gum). This fast demonstrates reverence and respect for the Body and Blood of Christ that we are going to receive. It also teaches us to hunger for Jesus in Holy Communion.

It is easy to fall into the trap of treating our reception of Jesus in the Eucharist in the same way that we manage many other things in our daily lives — one more act that we must do in our routine — and this does not allow us to pause and see how infinitely different this act really is. When presenting oneself for Communion, one must pause to receive the Host. "... As soon as the communicant receives the Host, he or she consumes the whole of it³." This means that we should pause long enough to immediately consume the Host in front of the priest, deacon, or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion before we proceed to our pew to pray. Part of the need to receive the consecrated Host immediately is to ensure the risk of profanation of the Blessed Sacrament is as minimized as possible. This way someone with careless, ignorant, or evil intent is prevented from walking off with the consecrated Host without consuming Jesus. The clergy as well as the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion have been instructed to watch each communicant to make sure that the Host is consumed. If anyone walks off with the Host, they will be stopped and told to either consume or return the Body of Christ. I ask you too, if you see someone walking off with the Host and not consuming it, please feel free to stop them.



(Reception of Holy Communion—Continued)

The issues revolve around receiving Communion in the hand. Reception of Communion in the hand, and immediate consumption, should be done by taking the Host from your palm and elevating your other hand to your mouth, ensuring nothing is lost and no particles remain or are dropped in the process. When receiving in the hand, the communicant should be guided by the words of St. Cyril of Jerusalem: *“When you approach, take care not to do so with your hand stretched out and your fingers open or apart, but rather place your left hand as a throne beneath your right, as befits one who is about to receive the King. Then receive him, taking care that nothing is lost.”*

I want to thank you for being truly diligent in this matter. The worship we offer God at Mass, and the way we do it as the Body of Christ, is given to us as a gift of the Church. This indeed is a sacred space and a sacred time in our week. Let us be refreshed by the Word of God we hear and strengthened by the Word made flesh that we consume in the Holy Eucharist. Above all may Christian charity, which is the heart of the Eucharist, guide us throughout our lives.



The Jesse Tree Project

The Jesse Tree Project is an important part of how we celebrate the Advent season at St. Paul. During the season of Advent, we prepare for the coming of the Messiah, Jesus Christ. We reflect upon his first joyful coming as a baby at Christmas, his coming into our lives each and every day, and his final coming at the end of time.

The Jesse Tree tradition is rooted in the words of the prophet Isaiah, *“There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots”* (Isaiah 11:1). Jesse is the father of King David, a key figure in the lineage of Jesus. Our Jesse Trees will resemble stumps, with the branches containing gift tags depicting symbols from the Old and New Testaments, that remind us of events that led to the birth of Christ.

The Jesse Tree also facilitates gift giving to the very many who are in need and served by **Holy Rosary and St. John**, and the **Community Kitchen**. The gifts will be distributed during the Christmas party hosted by our parish. Maximize your giving dollars before the ball drops on New Year’s Eve by using funds in your retirement account to support St. Paul the Apostle Parish. The **IRA Charitable Rollover** allows donors who are 70.5 years and older to transfer up to \$100,000 from a traditional or Roth IRA to a qualified charity like The Catholic Foundation. In doing so, donors keep their IRA distribution from impacting their gross income and possibly avoid being bumped into a higher tax bracket. The IRA charitable rollover can also count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD), which starts at age 72.

All transfers must be made directly from an IRA custodian to The Catholic Foundation by **Thursday, December 15th** to qualify as a 2022 rollover and be excluded from the donor’s taxable income.

The Second Sunday of Advent, December 4 (Cycle A)


First Reading: Isaiah 11:1-10 Second Reading: Romans 15:4-9 Gospel: Matthew 3:1-12

John tells his followers that the time has come for them to reform their lives. His baptism was a ceremony for followers to express their intention of conversion. And John promised that the one to follow him would baptize with the Holy Spirit and with fire, a baptism that would carry the power of God.

John the Baptist speaks the truth without fear. He is focused and his message is clear. It is stark and bold and unflinching: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" (v. 2) What can John's preaching and demeanor have to do with preparation for Christmas?

On behalf of The Community Kitchen at Holy Rosary/St. John and the Holy Rosary/St. John & Community Kitchen Partnership Committee here at St. Paul's, we'd like to extend a most sincere thank you to all of our parishioners who participated in making this year's **25th** annual **"Bring A Turkey To Church"** weekend very successful and fulfilling!

Thanks to your caring spirit, we received **465** turkeys and **\$4,354** in donations! Just as important, we received a huge quantity of food items needed for the holiday meals. Your kind generosity was overwhelming! This year, the Kitchen was able to return to dine in dinners. They served **550** warm Thanksgiving meals to hungry families and individuals who otherwise may not have had a hot Thanksgiving dinner. In addition to its two locations, the Community Kitchen serves 2 homeless camps, the Fresh Market For All People and the Westside Free Store. Once again this year, they were also able to supply **101** turkeys to St. Dominic's for their Family Baskets Program. **40** turkeys went to the St. John Pantry and another **20** to a church near the Community Kitchen in need for the holidays. The total number of meals served by the Community Kitchen for the year will exceed **160,000!** Your gifts touched many people in need and will continue to help feed them throughout the coming year.

In 25 years of our **"Bring A Turkey To Church"** collection, St. Paul parishioners have contributed a whopping **8,754** turkeys and have donated **\$31,227** to help those in need!

Special thanks to the St. Paul boys' basketball team, their coaches and parents for all the help they provided. They volunteered their time to help load, transport, and unload the hundreds of turkeys collected along with the huge quantity of other food items. Their help was greatly appreciated!

Taking the time and making the effort to stop and buy a turkey or two may not seem significant, but the combined efforts of our large parish family makes a significant impact! The true spirit of the teaching of Jesus and His message of stewardship are truly alive and well here at St. Paul's.
