THE CATECHETICAL CORNER



Why Does It Keep Changing?

First and foremost, I want to wish you and your family a very happy and blessed Easter Season. I pray that this may be a time of rejoicing in the risen Lord. As we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior, a major question always seems to arise: Why does the date of Easter change every year? This is a great question and one that would expand the scope of this article. However, I would like to give a little background and history of the ever-changing holiday.

In the early centuries of Christianity, churches in different parts of the world celebrated Easter at different times and in various ways. Some churches, especially those with direct Jewish roots, celebrated Easter on the day of Passover, tying the feast of the Pascha to the Last Supper and centering the feast of the resurrection on that day they said this was the custom since the time of the apostles. This practice eventually came to be called Quartodecimanism, meaning fourteenth, as it was the name given to the practice of celebrating Easter on the 14th of Nisan (Jewish month of Spring).

However, other churches, including the Diocese of Rome, thought the celebration of Easter should be on Sunday, and the date should not necessarily be tied directly to Passover. Eventually, that disagreement got severe, leading to attempts to excommunicate the bishops who led the Quartodecimanist dioceses. The controversy nearly led to schism. And it was complicated; scholars are still debating the exact contours of the disagreement.

In 325, the Council of Nicea decided the whole Church needed to standardize the date for Easter. Rome won that debate in a certain sense: Nicea agreed that the Roman way of calculating Easter's date should be used everywhere.It took a few centuries before things were entirely worked out. Different Christian churches disagree strongly with the way that history unfolded. Eventually, however, it became standard among Christians that Easter should be celebrated:

- On the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox.
- After Passover.

The vernal equinox is when day and night are the same length. From that point on, the days begin getting longer than the nights. The Church has mostly considered it a fixed date (March 21, for most people). This calculation method, known as the Gregorian lunar calendar, sets Easter as the first Sunday after the first full moon following the vernal equinox. This system ensures that Easter always falls between March 22 and April 25, aligning it with the rebirth of nature in the springtime.

In contemplating the changing date of Easter, we are invited to reflect on the dynamic nature of time itself. Time, in its essence, is not a static construct but rather a fluid continuum, ever-flowing and evolving. It reminds us of earthly matters' impermanence and divine truths' constancy. Each year, as Easter approaches, we are called to embrace this temporal variability, recognizing it as a testament to the enduring nature of our faith amidst the changing tides of the world.

Moreover, the fluctuating date of Easter serves as a poignant reminder of the rich tapestry of traditions that encompass our faith. Just as the date of Easter evolves with each passing year, so does our understanding of God's love and grace. Our faith is not bound by rigid conventions but instead thrives in the vibrant diversity of human experience. As we celebrate Easter each year, we are reminded of the multifaceted nature of our beliefs and the myriad ways they manifest in our lives.

In embracing the changing date of Easter, we are called to deepen our spiritual journey and draw closer to the heart of our faith. Let us use this opportunity to reflect on the timeless message of Easter – the triumph of light over darkness, of hope over despair. May the variability of Easter remind us of the eternal truth of God's love, everpresent and unwavering, guiding us through the changing seasons of life.

As we continue our pilgrimage of faith, let us rejoice in the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ and the promise of redemption it brings.

May the changing date of Easter serve as a beacon of hope, illuminating our path and leading us ever closer to the divine. Happy Easter!






The Fourth Promise


